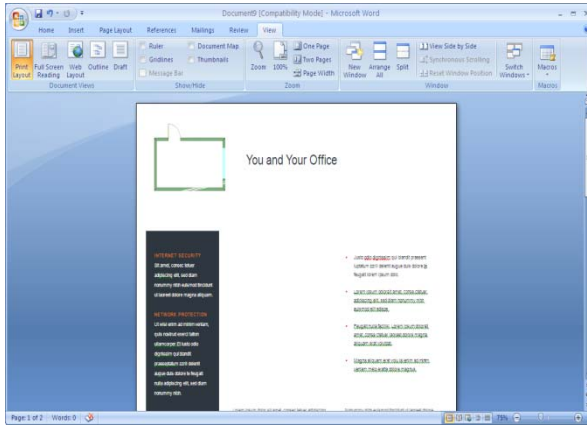


What can you do with Easy Blue Print?

Easy Blue Print helps you quickly create nice-looking floor plans. Most people use it to create brochures or flyers for their office or home floor plans. But, you can use it for almost anything, even to make images that you can email to your friends or customers. Easy Blue Print will work with almost any other Windows-based program – just paste your drawing into Microsoft Word (or whatever your favorite program is).

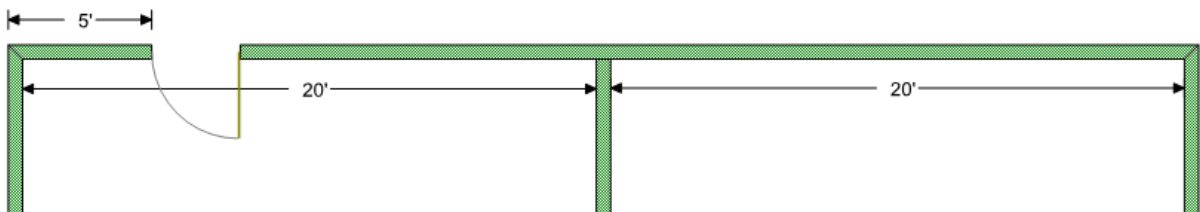


The center piece of Easy Blue Print is wall drawing. You can:

- create walls
- add windows and doors to walls
- join walls end-to-end
- create wall T-intersections

There are several tools for getting precise measurements for walls and distances.

- You can turn on the “snap to grid” feature, which causes walls and dimension to snap to specific lengths.
- Or, you can use features specific to the Pro version of Easy Blue Print, which let you select specific items and type in exact values for lengths/positions (the position of a door or window in a wall, or the intersection location between two walls, etc....).



But, Easy Blue Print isn't just about walls. Easy Blue Print comes with a long list of symbols for common objects, such as desks, beds, and furniture as well. And ... it comes jam-packed with a bunch of tools to draw lines, arcs, rectangles, polygons, and text.

What is the best way to get started? Probably the best way to start with Easy Blue Print is to first watch the tutorials – a picture is worth a thousand words. Then, when you want to get specifics on how to accomplish a certain task, it might be good to look at the docs. A great doc to start with is the document on how to draw walls.

But, Before You Begin....

Wouldn't it be great if Easy Blue Print just asked you a few questions and then automatically created a floor plan for your office or home? Although some programs might *try* to do something like this, Easy Blue Print wasn't designed this way...it's designed for flexibility.

So, even though Easy Blue Print tries to make using CAD tools simple, there is *still a learning curve* with Easy Blue Print. It's still a CAD program. Be persistent. You will *eventually* learn how to do things quickly and simply.

Even if you have a lot of CAD experience, some things might be different than what you're used to (or the way they should be).

But, if you get stuck, it is almost a certainty that:

- It isn't you. We probably need to fix something.
- The software documentation isn't good enough.
- The program needs to be changed.
